The Revd Denise Dodd

The Revd Denise has been installed and licensed as the new Vicar of Greasley, at St Mary's church on November 7th. The service was led by the Bishop of Sherwood, the Right Reverend Dr Andy Emerton, and the Archdeacon of Newark, The Venerable Tors Ramsey.

Born and raised in Hucknall, Denise was ordained as deacon in 2009 and became a priest a year later. In 2014, she moved to County Durham where she was Chaplain and office manager to the Bishop of Durham until this year. Denise said, "I look forward to this new chapter of ministry in the communities and parish of Greasley. I love to see people grow in their love for God, their commitment to one another and their communities and am eager to see where God will lead St Mary's and the

wider community in the coming years."

The Revd Mike Forsyth

The Revd Mike, formerly Assistant Curate for the benefice of Chilwell with Inham Nook, was licensed as Vicar of Porchester on 11 November. Before training for ordained ministry in 2015, Mike was in the Royal Air Force serving as a Logistics Officer at several locations in the UK and abroad. Mike is excited to serve as Vicar of Porchester, his heart is to see lives and communities transformed as the love and light of Jesus is shared with neighbours, colleagues, friends, and family.

The first word, hospitality, is particularly meaningful to me because my college days as a chef, I have loved to cook for people and entertain. And throughout my life it's been around food where I've seen the signs of God's kingdom at work, especially in this last two years. The service itself was lovely, and I felt hugely encouraged by the words of welcome and

turnout from the congregation to support me as I step into this new ministry role."

The Revd Emily Charkham

On 7 November, Bishop Paul ordained the Revd Emily to the Office of Priest at St Luke's, Gamston. Emily's journey to ordination began in a field in Somerset surrounded by thousands of young people worshipping Jesus. After a lot of prayer, she wanted to enable others in their faith and decided to pursue ordination. In the first week of lockdown, Emily received an email from the diocese exploring a curacy at St Luke's. During a subsequent Zoom call with Bishop Paul, she opened the conversation with the words, 'If I have to go it is because I need to call an ambulance' as her family were ill with coronavirus.

Over the next few weeks, Emily's dad and brother were put on ventilators and her future was put on hold. Thankfully, both recovered. In May 2021, members of her support bubble were involved in a car accident, which meant that Emily's Petertide ordination date was put on hold. Emily reflected, "I spent the week

contemplated the last eighteen months and God's goodness and faithfulness through it all, it has been tough, but He has been 'an everpresent help in trouble', and I looked forward to a future of building up His people and Church from a place of relying on and knowing Him as the Creator, Saviour of the World, and my friend."
